What is Memorial Day?

Memorial Day is a United States holiday that honors the men and women who have died while serving in the military. It is observed on the last Monday of May and marks a time to remember, reflect, and give thanks for the sacrifices made for freedom.

1. Write a Thank-You Letter to a Soldier

Use the space below to write a letter to a soldier or veteran. Even though Memorial Day honors those who have passed, writing a thank-you letter is a way to show appreciation for service members in general.

9. Moment of Silence

Guide children to observe a moment of silence at 3 PM local time to honor fallen heroes

— the National Moment of Remembrance. You can set a timer and quietly reflect for
one minute.

10. Craft: Make a Memorial Day Wreath

Use red, white, and blue paper to cut out stars and flowers. Arrange them into a wreath shape to hang on the front door in memory and honor.
